Bearded Dragon

Common Name: Inland Bearded Dragon

Scientific Name: Pogona vitticeps

General Info: The Inland Bearded Dragon is most commonly found in Australia. Males may grow as big a two feet long while females are usually smaller.

Temperature: Daily temperatures should be set between 80 and 105 degrees Fahrenheit. Nightly temperatures should be no less than 65 degrees Fahrenheit. You may want to create humidity by occasional misting of enclosure.

Lighting: The Bearded Dragon requires full spectrum lighting and U.V. radiation.

Feeding/Watering: You may feed your Bearded Dragon crickets, jumbo mealworms, or baby mice. Vitamin or calcium coated fruits and vegetables may also be fed to your Bearded Dragon. Change the water daily since it is being used for drinking and soaking purposes. Clean frequently.

Habitat/Housing: A ten to twenty gallon terrarium is recommended for babies and juveniles while a larger, custom-built tank is required for adults. You may landscape by creating a few shelters with hollow logs, driftwood, and other artificial plants and formations.
