Red Head Agama

Common Name: Red Head Agama

Scientific Name: Agama agama

General Info: This Red Head Agama is from Africa and grows to about sixteen inches long. In breeding condition, males have a reddish head and tail tip. These creatures should be treated for internal parasites regularly. One male per enclosure is recommended because of aggressiveness.

Temperature: The daily temperature should be between eighty-five and one hundred and five degrees Fahrenheit. Nightly temperature should range from seventy-five to eighty-five degrees Fahrenheit.

Lighting: Full spectrum lighting and U.V. radiation in recommended for long-term maintenance.

Feeding/Watering: Red Head Agamas should be fed crickets, mealworms, beetles, spiders, etc. You should provide a shallow dish of fresh water for drinking, and occasionally mist terrarium to provide a little moisture in the morning.

Habitat/Housing: For one male and two females, a thirty gallon terrarium is required. Landscape by creating shelters and basking areas with hollow logs, cork bark slabs, and diftwood.

Other Notes: The Egyptian Agama that is from the middle east can be maintained under similar conditions.
